

Dear Prospective Undergraduate Student,

We are glad to learn of your interest in our college and assure you that we will do everything we can to assist you in the application process. However, at this stage of your inquiry, let me give you the proper and official procedure in filing your application and relate to you other important and pertinent information, which will help you as you prepare for your future studies.

1. **ACADEMIC RECORDS:** We will need to have sent directly to this office, from the institutions where you studied, official transcripts of your work to date. These records must bear the institution's seal and should list all the courses you have taken, grades received in each course, number of semester hours earned, and any certificate, diploma, degree or other recognition received. This is a requirement of our Admissions Committee. Also, we must have your transcripts so that all your work can be evaluated and we can determine your status and the length of time required to complete your program. These transcripts must be sent in English.

2. **COST OF STUDY:** For your information, the following is a listing of approximate basic expenses for a year of academic study (September-May) at Springfield College:

3. **FINANCIAL GUARANTEE:** A strictly enforced regulation of the United States Immigration Service makes it necessary for us to receive a guarantee of your financial support for the period of time you will be here. If an acceptance is given, we will require a deposit of money, which will be credited to your account, before we issue the US Government's Immigration Form I-20.

4. **APPLICATION FORM:** Enclosed you will find an application form for admission to the Bachelor's Degree Program. If you can fulfill the above requirements and intend to apply, file this with our office along, with the application fee of fifty US dollars (\$50) at your earliest convenience. As soon as this is received and your official transcripts are sent and evaluated, we will be pleased to continue with your request to be considered for admission. Please understand that no application will be accepted without the application fee of \$50.

5. ENGLISH PROFICIENCY (TOEFL): Under both US Immigration and College regulations, a prospective international student must submit evidence of his/her proficiency to read, write and speak the English language. To fulfill this requirement, you should contact your regional TOEFL (Test Of English As A Foreign Language) Office and be tested as early as possible. The recommended score for a Bachelor's Degree candidate, based on the recently incorporated computer-based testing system, is 195.
